

EU Custom Procedures & Export Licences/Controls

Any International trading company knows their goods have to clear through Customs effectively in order to deliver the goods on time. Understanding Customs procedures is therefore, a fundamental requirement for any clerk or manager involved in export/import. Some of the Customs regimes/procedures are quite involved. As an example, export control/licences and IPR are major subjects in there own right. This Course provides a formal training forum for these types of Customs regimes. The day will provide a more in-depth look into what is required to comply with the law.
